April Speaker: Dana B. Keane, Incivility in a Civil Profession

Over the last twenty plus years, the practice of law has undergone a lot of change. Most of those changes have made the practice of law easier but some have fostered incivility and a lack of professionalism. The casualness of e-mail communications has led to some attorneys forgetting that they are still communicating in their professional capacity. The advent of Zoom hearings during Covid has resulted in some attorneys forgetting the decorum of the courtroom. There are also many examples of uncivil conduct between attorneys and the Florida Bar has made an effort to crack down on this behavior. Ms. Keane will discuss some recent examples of unprofessional conduct and incivility in the profession.

Amicus Personae - Mark Rice Member of the Association of Retired Attorneys of Sarasota

Mark Rice was born in Aberdeen, South Dakota. Mark is the fifth generation in his family to practice law, going back to the territorial days of the State of South Dakota. To ensure the tradition was not broken, at an early age his Dad took him down to his office while he worked on week-ends, and took him to the Sheriff's office when he was five years old, while his Dad interviewed criminal clients. Later, while in high school he would work on demonstrative exhibits for his Dad's trials.

Following the family tradition, Mark attended the University of South Dakota where he graduated in 1978 with a BA in political science. However, in a break from family tradition, rather than attending law school in Chicago, Mark went to law school at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. Thinking he would be a trial lawyer Mark was active in Moot Court as its President and took every trial advocacy course he could. Upon graduation, he was faced with a big decision. Go back to South Dakota and practice with his Dad or go someplace where his family did not have any presence. Aberdeen is a small town of about 23,000 people, and it was not stretch of imagination to say everyone knew his Dad. Sioux Falls was another option, but there he would run into the legacy of his Grandfather, who was a circuit court judge. So next door to Omaha was lowa, with lots of mid-size small towns and the opportunity to make a name for himself, unencumbered by the family legacy.

Graduating in 1982 from law school in the upper Midwest was not the best time to be looking for a job with no connections. The Midwest was in the middle of a farm crisis. Mark started out working in small town lowa with a firm that had incorporated Winnebago industries, the motorhome manufacturer. He then went to work for a firm in Sioux City, lowa where he was introduced to bankruptcy and commercial litigation. As luck would have it he was working on a case with a law firm from Des Moines and after the case was completed he was offered a job with the Des Moines firm.

Coming from Aberdeen, Des Moines was the big time. Mark's new firm was deep into the agricultural crisis legal work representing the FDIC as it closed numerous banks in the Midwest. This allowed Mark the opportunity to work on FDIC receivership issues, utilizing the special powers the FDIC enjoyed, and director and officer litigation. Mark was able to expand his work into representing regional and national banks and other financial institutions with commercial litigation and loan restructures and his work can be seen in the 18 published cases he handled. Life changes, and with that so does a law practice. Mark joined the Whitfield & DLC law firm and by the early 2000s Mark's practice evolved from being focused on commercial litigation to counseling financial institutions on best practices, and negotiating and drafting loan documents. In the non-bank arena Mark's practice developed into representing privately held mid-market companies, ultimately resulting in being part of the deal team that won the 2011 10th Annual M& Mamp; A Advisor Lower Middle Market Deal of the Year. Mark's skills were recognized by an AV rating in Martindale, and by Best Lawyers, and Chambers.

Mark has been a strong believer in giving back to the community. Mark enjoyed mentoring young associates as chair of his firm's Business and Banking practice group, mostly enjoyed his time as Chair of his firm's management committee, and always enjoyed being a frequent speaker at state and regional seminars. Mark was active in the Polk County, Iowa, and Federal Bar Associations. Outside of the practice of law Mark was a member of the Central Iowa Red Cross Board, Member and President of the St Augustin School board of education and active in the West Des Moines Rotary Club and local political campaigns.

Since the mid 1980s Mark and his spouse, Erin enjoyed coming to Sarasota to visit Erin's parents. When it came time to consider retirement, Sarasota was an easy decision. Mark relocated to Sarasota in July, 2022 and retired from the practice of law at the end of December, 2022. The long family tradition of practicing law came to an end with Mark. Both of his daughters work in Chicago in non-legal fields. However, they are not remiss in reminding him that being raised by a lawyer has given them some great life skills. Mark is looking forward to being an active part of the Sarasota community.
